#### USING YOUR SENSES TO FIND A TIGER :

The key to successful tiger spotting lies in the jungle's reactions to the animal's movement. When the king of the forest is on the move, his kingdom is as responsive as the court of any of the great Mughal Emperors.

Peacocks blare, Sambar bell, Spotted Deer call, Langurs explode in cough-like alarm, Jungle Fowl screech, Bison whistle shrilly and barking deer emit the impossibly raucous bark for which they are named.

The continuous repetition of such calls as well as their combination from two or more species in the same small area of the forest is a very good sign that a Tiger is moving nearby.

Using your ears to listen to what other animals are saying is a good method of locating a Tiger.

**KANHA TIGER RESERVE :** Nested in the ranges of the Satpuras in Madhya Pradesh and abounding in Sal and mixed forests, Kanha was one of the first 9 Project Tiger areas initiated in 1973. The total area covers 1945 sq. kms with a core area of 940 sq. kms. The area was enlarged after Project Tiger was initiated.

The management input into Kanha Tiger Reserve of the Central Indian Highlands, from where the reverberating call of the tiger and the braying of the mating hard ground Barasingha resounds has probably achieved quite spectacular results during the past two decades. Though the management is far from satisfied from the results, which reflects the uncompromising, dedicated and may be somewhat impatient but correct approach, yet it must be said, that Kanha is most likely the area, where most of the objectives of Project Tiger had been very faithfully pursued.







#### TIGER SAFARI : KANHA TIGER RESERVE.

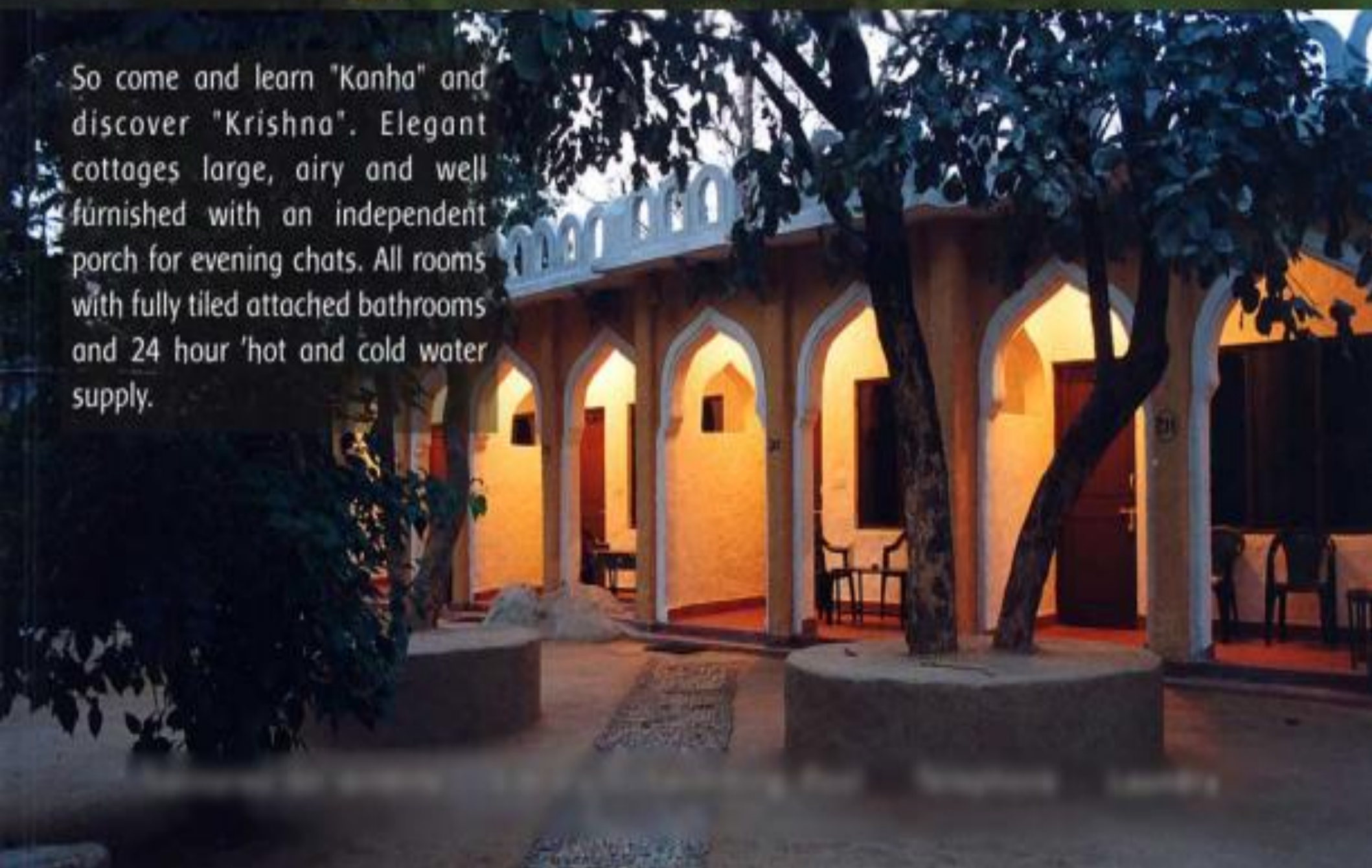

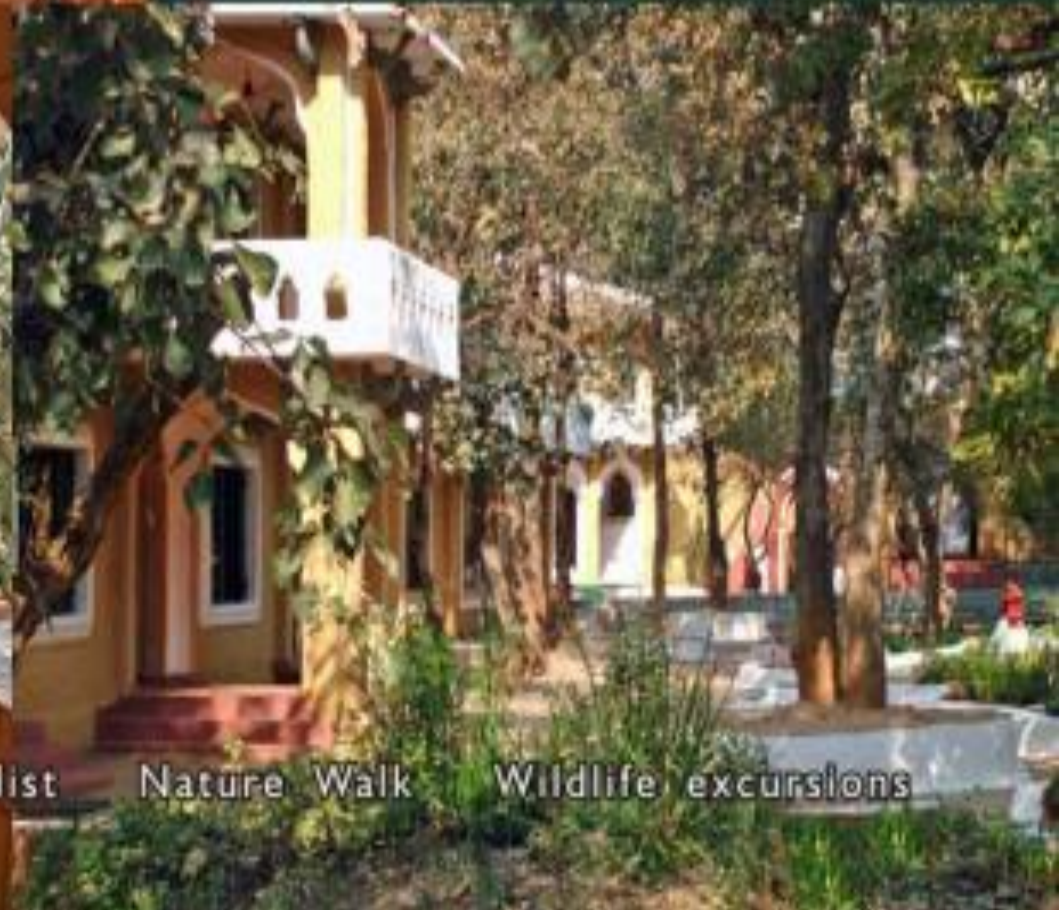

**Stay:** 4-5 days at least for good wildlife sighting and tribal interests.

**Attire:** Neutral khakis, grey and green clothes recommended.

**Accessories:** Camera, binoculars, sunglasses, and hats.

**Airport/Rail Head:** Jabalpur - 170 kms, Nagpur - 270 kms.

**Best Season:** 1st October to 30th June.

**Climate:** October-February is cold. March-April is moderate. May-June is warm.

## Old Rest-House

This rest-house, built in 1910, marked the beginning of scientific forestry operations in Kanha. Today it does not have the colonial decor of the past when British sportsmen stayed here. They came on foot, on horseback or elephant. There were no roads to lead their way to this remote jungle, nor electricity connections.
